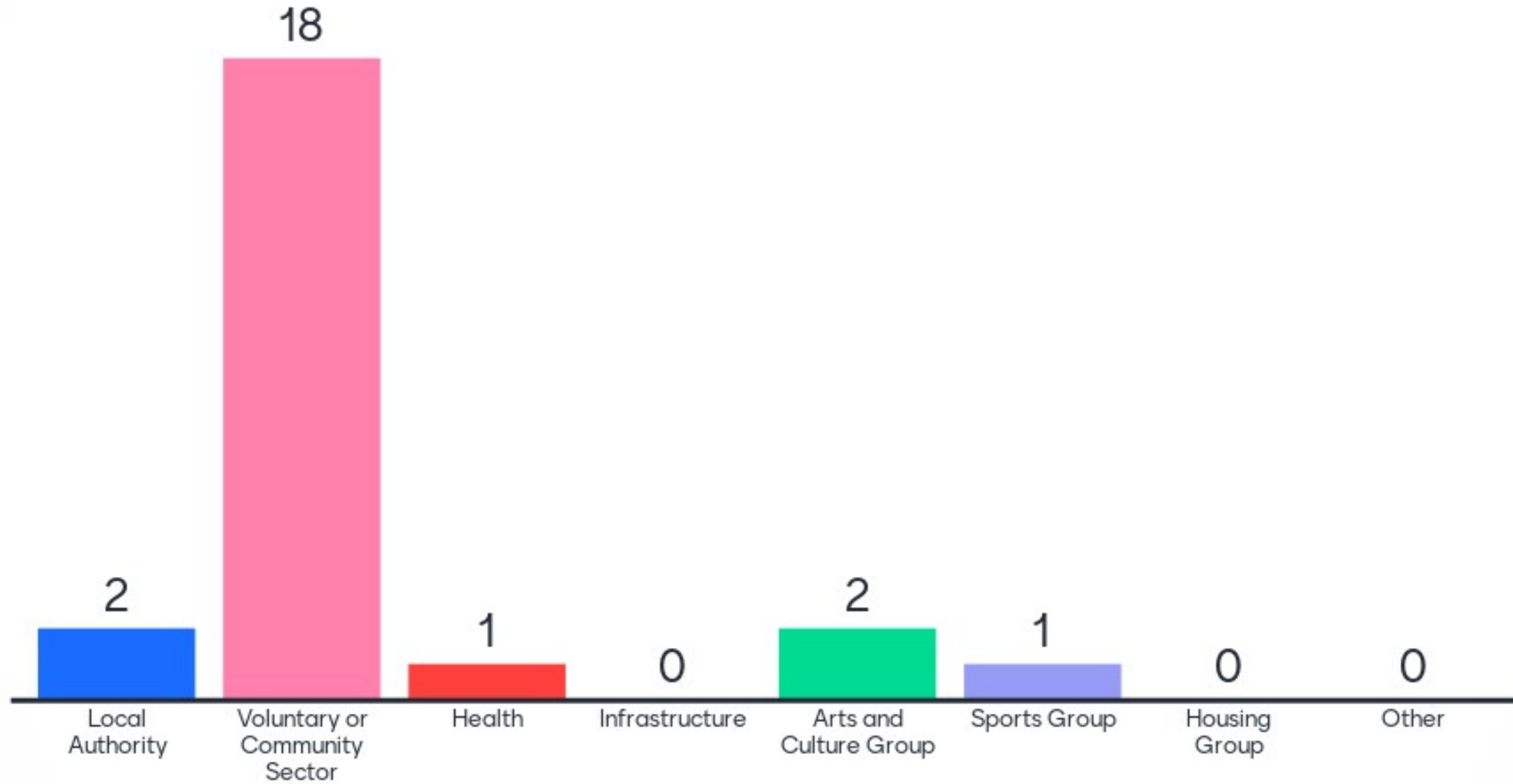


What type of organisations do you represent ?
